Risk/Need Assessment Analysis

The Risk/Need Assessment (RNA) is the core of the learning curriculum in Pay Tel's Pathway to Achieve Learning system. These questions are designed to assess each detainees criminal thinking (likelihood to reoffend) and need for education. After completing the RNA, the detainee learner is enrolled in course work that addresses their individual educational needs and their criminal attitudes and behaviors.

262 Detainees Completed the Risk Need Assessment

- 216 of those detainees went on to take Pathway to Achieve Courses
- This reflects an 82% engagement rate

Allegany County Detainee Response Analysis

CRIMINAL THINKING, SELF-CONTROL, AND ANGER

51% Think that most people break the law.

36% Admit they lack self-control. Most detainees in the Allegany County Detention Center do things that feel good in the moment but regret later and act without thinking of the consequences.

33% Get angry easily.

EDUCATION

28% Do not have a High School Diploma or GED.

53% Want to attend college.

18% Have literacy challenges.

JOB READINESS

43% Have been looking for a job and are not able to be hired.

55% Do not feel they make enough money for basic necessities and are often looking for a better job.

RELATIONSHIPS

22% Admit they argue with their significant other daily or several times a week.

63% Want to improve their relationships with their children.

27% Say they hang around people that encourage them to do bad things.

ADDICTION AND MENTAL HEALTH

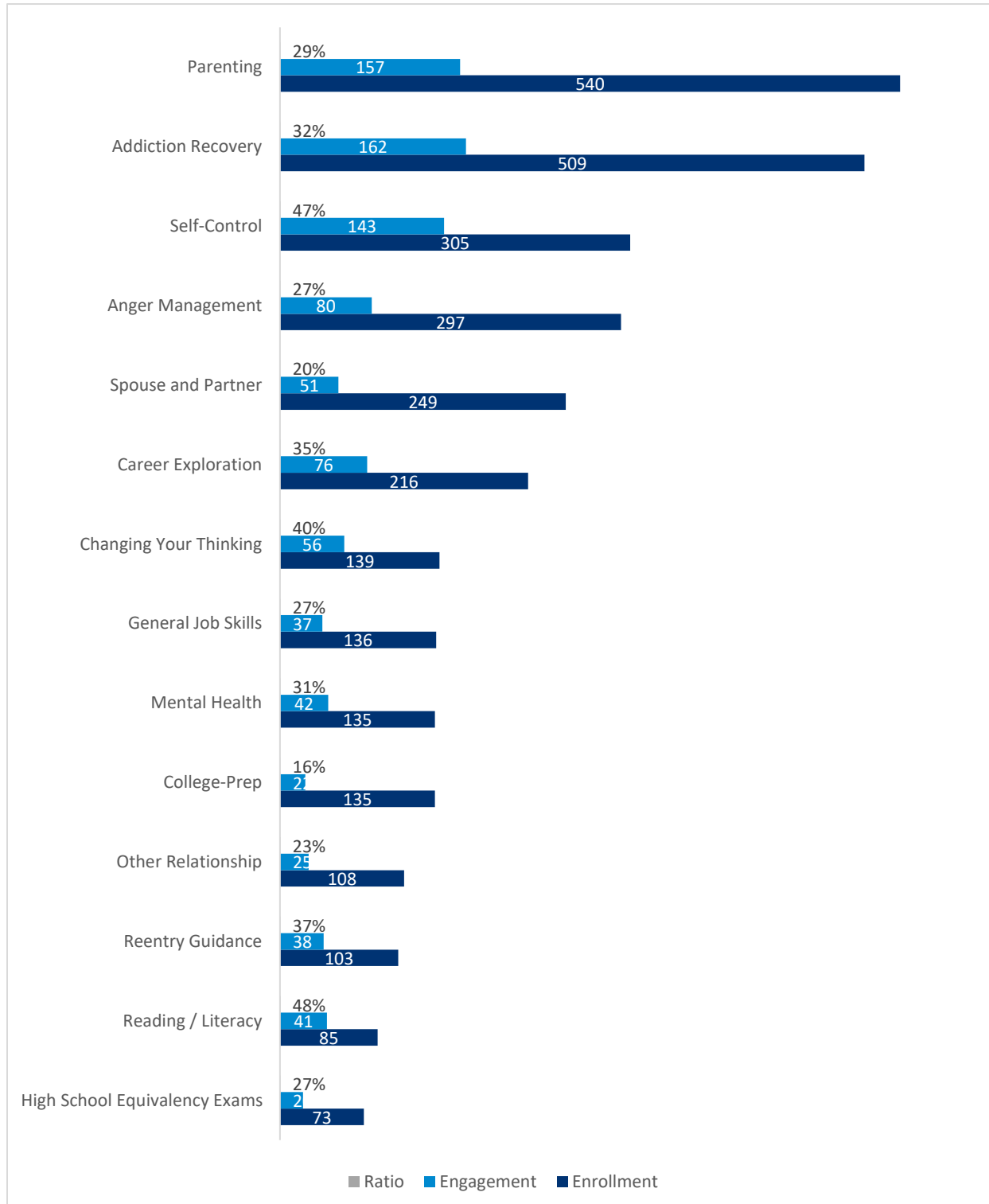
71% Admit they are addicted to alcohol and/or drugs.

63% Want treatment for their addictions.

52% Want help with their mental health.

Suggested Course Engagement

Allegany County detainees have been enrolled in over 3,030 suggested courses based on their RNA responses. The detainees that stated they have issues with criminal thinking, addiction, literacy, and self-control have participated in courses on those topics.

12 Steps to Recovery The Twelve Step programs are well known for their use in recovering from addictive and dysfunctional behaviors.	54 Hours 57 Minutes
Cognitive Strategies for Self-Control In this course, learners will learn the definition of self-control. They will be introduced to the science of self-control including: willpower, delaying gratification, thinking about end results, and goal setting.	41 Hours 2 Minutes

Allegany County Course Completion Highlights

- Learners are completing self-improvement courses at a rate of almost twice as much as educational and vocational courses.
 - These completion rates could indicate that your detainee population sees gaining basic education or advancing their self-improvement skills, such as changing their thinking, as their number one goal.
 - This matches the Risk/Need Assessment results, which reflect over **36%** of your population indicated they lack self-control and do things that feel good in the moment but regret later and act without thinking of the consequences.
- 52% of your detainee population indicated that they want to improve their mental health. Over the past year **658** courses have been completed in the Mental Health category.
- 63% of your detainee population self-identified that they want help with their addiction. Over the past year **4,074** courses have been completed on Addiction Recovery.

Our findings indicate that newly released citizens will be better educated, have better coping strategies, be better prepared for work and family obligations, and less likely to reoffend, which has a significant positive impact to the community.

COST OF COMPARABLE PROGRAMS

Pay Tel provides inteTABLET™ at no cost to Allegany County Detention Center. In contrast, as stated in our third-party study, to provide a single detainee with all the educational opportunities provided on Pay Tel's inteTABLET™ would cost a jail an estimated \$1,731.09 per detainee every year.

The Rand Study "Evaluating the Effectiveness of Correctional Education" proved that individuals who participate in correctional education programs had a **43% lower odds of re-offending** than those who did not.
